Q How many people are college students really having sex with?

A. Every spring here at the UA, the Campus Health Service administers a Health and Wellness survey to randomly selected undergraduate classes. Questions asked range from basic demographics and GPA to sexual health and alcohol use and everything in between. Here are some results from our 2012 survey (n=2,406) among students who reported being sexually active in the past school year:

- 45% had one partner
- 12% had two partners
- 9% had 3 or more partners

- 4% had 6 or more partners

Altogether, 70% of UA students reported being sexually active in the past school year, and most of them (57%) had either one or two partners. The other 30% either hadn't ever had sex, or hadn't had sex in the past school year.

When it comes to sex, everyone makes their own decision that is right for them and these statistics support that. Here at the UA (and other colleges nationwide), whether you are sexually active or not, you're in good company.

Q Where can people acquire the morning after pill on the weekends or holidays?

A. The morning after pill, also known as Plan B, can be purchased by anyone over the age of 17. On weekends or holidays, it can be purchased at a local pharmacy or drugstore for \$40-\$50. During the week you can buy Plan B at retail stores, Planned Parenthood, and right here on campus at the Campus Health Pharmacy for \$35. We're open

Monday-Friday, 8am-4:30pm. Here's a tip: buy Plan B ahead of time. That way if it's needed, it can be taken right away.
